

Herbert Hensley Henson (1863-1947) was Bishop of Durham 1920 to 1939. He is remembered best as a man of conviction and controversy. At one time a staunch advocate of the Church's establishment, he became a strong voice for disestablishment on the bishops' bench. This public lecture series, which bears his name, continues Henson's legacy, reflecting critically on the political relationship between Church and state and the balance of benefits and compromises it entails.
