

### **Format:**

For each session, the **Sanskrit Reading Room** invites one scholar to lead a two-hour reading workshop on a text of his or her choice. The reader can (a) contextualise (b) read line by line (c) translate and/or (d) discuss research issues and outputs on the selected text. The text may be related to the guest reader's current research. PDFs of the text will be circulated beforehand, and registered workshop participants will be expected to have spent time studying the PDF in advance. Non-registered participants are also welcome and may follow the readings without preparation.

Participation will be open to all students of Sanskrit, at both undergraduate and postgraduate level, from all UK institutions of higher education.
