Science and Religion: Exploring the Spectrum' project overview: Our project seeks to build an understanding of the social and cultural contexts of public perceptions of the relationship between 'science' and 'religion' across all faiths and none. This innovative and unique research project will employ four intersecting approaches: social science field research; oral history, historical and media analysis; experimental social psychology; and a large-scale survey of public perceptions, attitudes and identity formation in the UK and Canada. - Plan, and conduct research activities including related literature reviews or desk based research across the SRES project in the area of religion/science, and to support on editing of project outputs as agreed with Dr Fern Elsdon-Baker
- Contributing to research based reports, presentations and papers (including potentially contributing to academic publications or drafting parts thereof), and to the writing of related downstream funding bids.
- Contributing to the development of public engagement and research impact based activity
- Where appropriate (and with support of wider research team) present research outputs, for example at seminars and as posters
- Carry out research administrative tasks related directly to the delivery of the research
- Assist on the co-ordination and delivery of conferences and events

- Other related areas of social scientific research

While in post mentoring and career support will be provided to assist the post holder to develop their research track and profile. Preference will thus be given to candidates with an interest in/enthusiasm for the subject matter of the project and the Centre's wider research.
