Issues in Teaching and Learning in the Study of Religions

- 15 minute paper which engages theoretically with teaching and learning in Religious Studies (200 word proposal)

- Interdisciplinary issues in teaching and learning
- Experiential and situational learning
- Level progression in subject content and skills development in RS
- Class, gender and disability issues in the RS classroom

- Developing students as researchers
- Using big data in the RS classroom
- Progression from A level RS to undergraduate
- Students of faith in the RS classroom
- Distance learning and MOOCs
- Equality and diversity issues in teaching and learning
- Impact of the Neo-liberal University on RS teaching and learning
